The Boca Raton Police Services Department is currently investigating the robbery/homicide of Nancy Bochicchio and Joey Bochicchio-Hauser, who were found in the parking lot of Town Center Mall, 6000 West Glades Road. The victims were discovered shortly after midnight on Thursday, 12/13/2007 by mall security, inside their black 2007 Chrysler Aspen. This case may be related to a previous incident that also occurred at the Town Center Mall in August 2007.

On Friday, 12/14/2007 a reward poster was released with a sketch and description provided by the first victim, and a reward offered by the City of Boca Raton in the amount of \$350,000.

On Tuesday, 12/18/2007, a statement was released with the names and photograph/sketch of David Goodman and "Charles", both of whom were wanted for questioning. Charles was believed to have had access to Nancy Bochicchio's cellular telephone at some point after the homicide. Later that evening, Goodman was located by Boca Raton detectives at a Burger King in Miami and was questioned by detectives. Goodman was later arrested by Miami Police Department on a Broward County warrant.

Late Wednesday night, 12/19/2007, "Charles", who has been identified as Charles Jackson, 50 years old, was located in Miami. During an interview with detectives, Jackson stated he found Nancy Bochicchio's cell phone in the area of 1500 NE 1st Ave., Miami.

Videos of Nancy and Joey Bochiccio entering and exiting Mall Entrance #4 (between Sears and Neiman Marcus) during the afternoon of Wednesday, December 12, 2007 are being released. Anyone who may have seen anything or has information in relation to these videos is asked to call (561) 338-1352.

The Bochiccio case is scheduled to be featured on Fox's America's Most Wanted program on Saturday, December 22, 2007.

In addition to the dozens of Department members working this case, officers are continuing to provide enhanced police patrols at the Town Center Mall as well as other public areas throughout the City. We ask that the public be vigilant and conscious of their surroundings while shopping and report any suspicious activity to police immediately.
